EXPLANATION:

This emergency order increases the sport fish bag and possession limit for pink salmon from 10 to 20 fish in Norton Sound, which includes all flowing waters draining into Norton Sound from Cape Prince of Wales to Point Romanof.

REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 70.011. (c)(3)(A) and (c)(9)(C) are superseded, and (c)(10)(A) is added by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective 12:01 a.m. Saturday, July 13, 2022:

5 AAC 70.011. Seasons and bag, possession, annual, and size limits for the Northwestern Area.

(c)(3) in Northern Norton Sound, which is described as all waters draining into Norton Sound from Cape Darby to Cape Prince of Wales on the Seward Peninsula, except Salmon Lake, the bag and possession limit for

(A) pink salmon is 20 fish, with no size limit;

(c)(9) in the Unalakleet River drainage,

(C) the bag and possession limit for salmon, other than king salmon, is 20 fish, of which only four fish, in combination, may be coho, chum, and sockeye salmon;

(c)(10) in all waters draining into Norton Sound from Cape Darby to Point Romanof, the bag and possession limit for

(A) pink salmon is 20 fish, with no size limit.

JUSTIFICATION:

Daily escapement counts of pink salmon at enumeration projects throughout Norton Sound are much higher than average and in drainages where there are escapement goals for pink salmon, all goals have been exceeded. In the Nome River, over 16,000 pink salmon have been counted as of July 11 with 75% of the run remaining. The sustainable escapement goal (SEG) for pink salmon in the Nome River is 13,000 fish. Likewise, in the North River, a tributary of the Unalakleet River, which has an SEG of 25,000 pink salmon, over 468,000 pink salmon have been counted as of July 11. Other nearby drainages, while not having escapement goals or enumeration projects, track similarly to the Nome and Unalakleet Rivers and are showing large runs of pink salmon as well. Due to the high escapement of pink salmon in the Nome and Unalakleet River Drainages as well as large runs of pink salmon in other drainages within Norton Sound, an increase in the bag and possession limit for pink salmon from 10 to 20 fish is warranted.
