

2020 Juneau Management Area Subsistence and Personal Use Salmon Fishing Permit Conditions

Personal Use Salmon Permit Conditions

1. Salmon may be taken for personal use only under the authority of a personal use fishing permit and only by holders of a valid Alaska sport fishing license, Alaska residents under the age of 18, or persons 60 years of age or older who have been issued a permanent identification card.
2. In the Taku River salmon may be taken only with set gillnets not exceeding 15 fathoms in length, only from the Taku River Lodge upstream to the U.S./Canada border, and only from July 13 through August 12. The permit holder is required to be physically present at the net while operating a set gillnet in the Taku River. Set gillnets may not be fished within 100 yards of Department of Fish and Game Taku River fish wheels.
3. In Sweetheart Creek salmon may be taken for personal use only upstream from a Department of Fish and Game regulatory marker located near the stream mouth. The use of spearguns and hook and line fishing for salmon are prohibited.
4. Chinook and coho salmon, trout and char may be taken only incidentally by gear operated under the personal use fishing guidelines of this permit. The personal use possession limits for Chinook and coho salmon, respectively, are 2 fish and 6 fish.

Subsistence Salmon Permit Conditions

1. Salmon may be taken for subsistence use only under the authority of a subsistence fishing permit and only by Alaska residents.
2. Chinook salmon, trout and char may be taken only incidentally by gear operated under the subsistence fishing guidelines of this permit. The possession limit for Chinook salmon is 2 fish.
